Key Responsibilities of the Local Governing Team

Time Commitment

Governors are appointed for a 4-year term of office. Governors are expected to attend Local Governor Team meetings 4-6 times per year for approximately 2 hours per meeting. The role involves preparing for meetings by reading reports and documents in advance. You will be encouraged to participate in school visits twice a year to observe and understand the school environment. You will also need to engage in ongoing training.
