

Overview

We will study a range of Philosophical and Ethical topics. In Ethics we will learn about different ideas about right and wrong in modern real life situations. This could be ideas about family, marriage, divorce, euthanasia, abortion, or issues on human rights. You can tackle the big questions of humanity: What is the meaning of life? How did we get here? What happens when we die? Why is there evil in the world? Does this sounds interesting to you?

Course Structure

Component one: Religious, philosophical and ethical issues in the world

Component two: Study of Christianity

Beliefs and teachings

Component three: Study of a world faith

Choice of: Islam, Judaism, Buddhism, Sikhism and Hinduism

Assessment

Component one – A 2 hour exam focussing on all 4 ethical and philosophical topics.

Component two – A 1 hour exam focussing on Christianity.

Component three – A 1 hour exam focussing on a world faith.

Exams - Pupils will be expected to interpret sources and be able to write in a thoughtful and logical manner. Pupils do not need to be religious but must be willing to analyse issues from different points of view.
