Preventing Extremism and Radicalisation

It can be hard to know what to do if you're worried someone close is expressing extreme views or hatred, which could lead to them harming themselves or others. Working with other organisations, the police protect vulnerable people from being exploited by extremists through a Home Office programme called Prevent.

Act early and tell them your concerns in confidence. You won't be wasting their time and you won't ruin lives, but you might save them.

#### British Sign Language Pandemic Programs for Derbyshire

The Signs4Life scheme is to help people to communicate and engage with children and adults who may be hard of hearing.

We wanted to open our programs to the general public, who might also have an interest in learning sign language, especially now that many people have been stuck at home during a third lockdown. We are offering a free 6-week BSL program, which you can enjoy and access from the comfort of your homes, delivered through Zoom".
