Overview

Foreign language skills, for both work and leisure, have become vital in the 21st century. Course Structure

Listening - examination in May/June in Year 11— **25%** of the marks.

Speaking - examination in May/June in Year 11— **25%** of the marks.

Reading - examination in May/June in Year 11— **25%** of the marks.

Writing - examination in May/June in Year 11— **25%** of the marks.

Languages boost your career prospects. Communicating in other languages is becoming more and more essential for people in the UK. Despite popular belief, not everyone worldwide speaks English or speaks it confidently. Speaking another language improves your chances of finding an interesting and often well-paid job and is very useful for communicating with colleagues abroad.
